Sport and Leisure Working Group

One of the aims of the Oakham Neighbourhood Plan is to enable the people of Oakham to have a say in how they would like the Sports and Leisure facilities already available developed and to identify if any additional Sports and Leisure facilities are required. The Sports and Leisure Working Group will work with all to gather the information required to enable informed decisions to be made on Sports and Leisure facilities within the plan.

AIM

Collect and collate information on the Sports and Leisure facilities available and how best to retain and further develop them.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. Research all Sport and Leisure facilities based within the plan, and produce a document identifying these facilities.
- 2. To produce a questionnaire based on this document.
- 3. Establish who the questionnaire will be distributed to.
 - a. All facilities identified.
 - b. All residents within the plan and surrounding area.
- 4. Discuss with the communications group, costs, means of distribution and collection of information.
 - a. Producing the questionnaire and distribution
 - b. Publicity through local media
 - c. Social media for gathering public opinion
 - d. Meetings with Sports and Leisure Groups
 - e. Liaising with Active Rutland team
- 5. Collate all information and format it into a report that gives a clear and accurate picture of how the people would like the Sports and Leisure facilities within the plan to be shaped for both now and the future.
- 6. Present and discuss the report with representatives from Rutland County Council to identify if this report based on the opinions of the people of Oakham and the surrounding area is aligned with there strategy for Sport and Leisure within the Oakham plan area.
- 7. Provide feedback to all who contributed to the report produced by the working group.
 - a. Press release
 - b. Local media
 - c. Social media
- 8. Present the information gathered along with the report produced so that it can be considered for inclusion into the Oakham Neighbourhood Plan.
